Manasa Jyothi Trust was started in 2000 with support from a local Trust. The Trust continues to be active and needs a lot of support.

The school is actively managed by Shobha Madhyastha and Maartje van den Brand a Physiotherapist from The Netherlands. The school is not funded by the government but by a private Trust and does not ask the parents for any fee. Therefore Manasa Jyothi provides, for disabled children without parents or with parents, who cannot or do not want to care for them, a place to live and receive education. For some children this school is their only chance in society.

REPORT

On 19/12/2018 a group of students from our college had the privilege of visiting Manasajyothi trust, koni.

Objectives:

The objectives of the visit were as follows:

- 1. To gain insight into the learning environment and methods used to support mentally and physically challenged children.
